As we stand at this historic juncture, I am deeply aware of the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead. The foundry industry is undergoing a transformation — driven by sustainability, digitisation and global competitiveness. Skill Development & Youth Engagement: Empowering the next generation through training, mentorship and industry-academia partnerships.

We have added new modules to the existing list of modules of NCSD and presently it stands at 22. Almost 60% of the modules are sponsored by the corporates as we aim to incorporate training to the shop floor team of every foundry to make the foundation strong enough for the building to rise multi-stories.

Urja Sanchay Project, initiated last year by my dear friend and WR Chair, Shri Saibal Sen, in Western Region was a successful project, benefitting foundries in reducing power consumption — the biggest raw material for any foundry. The Urja Sanchay Project was launched this year at the national level and, in the first phase, we plan to benefit about 75 foundries across all four regions, to be coordinated and executed by NCTS.

I am thankful to the two corporates, Oritech Solutions and Allied Refractory Products India, for sponsoring this national project and we are confident that we will be able to achieve the target of 150 foundries by the end of this tenure. This project has generated excellent savings of a few lakh rupees to crores in a year to the foundries, depending upon their production capacity.
