ACTIVITIES

#71st Indian Foundry Congress/IFEX-2023

As a Host Region IIF Northern Region organized this year 71st Indian Foundry Congress, the flagship event of the Indian Foundry industry was held at India Expo Centre & Mart, Greater Noida, Delhi -NCR during 8-10 February 2023.

All roads led to Greater Noida during the three days, where the Maha kumbha of the Indian Foundrymen took place. Over 1500 delegates from the foundry, Theme: Arise, Automate & Aatmanirbhar equipment, raw materials, academies, government agencies and also other sectors participated in the IFC to review the various aspects of the metal casting industry.

The three-day event of international standard offered an array of events like inaugural function, Fellowship conferring, Awards distribution, Technical Sessions, Cast Source Meets, Casting Clinic, B2B Meetings, Special sessions on Railways, Defence, Cost savings by sustainable energy sources, Electric vehicles, CEO Meet, Entertainment programmes and Valedictory function.

A galaxy of eminent speakers from the industry, academies and government departments/agencies shared their views and valuable information on the Indian Foundry industry producing 12.45 million tonnes of castings; the second largest producer of castings in the world. A number of presentations focusing on the Theme "Arise, Automate & Aatmanirbhar" were made in various forums of the Congress. They reviewed the status of the Foundry industry - Mother of all industries.



Government representatives and technocrats also in their presentations threw light on the challenges faced by the industries and offered possible solutions.

On Feb 8, 2023 evening the inaugural function of the grand show of 71st IFC was held before a large number of delegates in the Forace Hall at India Expo Centre & Mart; one of the best convention centres of the country with all modern facilities.

Mr Vikas Garg, Co-Chairman, 71st IFC Organising Committee in his opening remarks mentioned that organising committe members had to work hard and had to cross several hurdles while preparing for the mega event

It was very tough to organize two versions of the mega shows in one financial year 2022-23. However, he said, there was an overwhelming response from the members and the industry as a whole.

Mr Garg then referred to the increasing demand for castings from the core sectors like Railways, Defence, infrastructure, mining etc. He also mentioned the special sessions of 71st IFC including session on Renewable sources of energy, from which foundrymen would have tremendous take-

aways. He further mentioned about other speakers from EV sector, Government representatives, and automotive sectors.

Mr Pradeep Mittal, Chairman, 71st IFC Organising Committee in his welcome address informed that entire space for IFEX 2023 had been sold out. He said that a number of in-depth presentations would be made on very relevant subjects by prominent personalities from industry, academies and govt departments/agencies.

Guest of Honour, Mr Ganesh Mani, President & COO, Ashok Leyland while addressing the inaugural session said that metal casting technique is a very old practice. Foundry industry is mother of all industries, as castings are needed by all industries. He appreciated foundrymen's effort for the progress of the industry. He further said that metal casting industry would progress tremendously in the years to come. He informed that Ashok Leyland is celebrating the 75th year of



its journey. Mr Mani mentioned that there has been a strong bond between IIF and Ashok Leyland for a long time.

According to the Guest of Honour, the Theme of the IFC is quite relevant to the present situation. Mr Mani stressed the need for attracting youngsters to foundry industry to build professional career in this basic industry. He stated that making smart foundries (Foundry 4.0) is the way to attract young engineers to cast metals industry. He also mentioned the present Government's urge to move the country's economy to achieve 5 trillion mark. In this regard he referred to the necessity of using renewable energy to cater to the increasing demand for energy for development in various sectors of India.

Seminar on "COST REDUCTION THROUGH ROOFTOP SOLAR"

Northern Region & Chandigarh Chapter of the Institute of Indian Foundrymen (IIF) has jointly organized a seminar on "COST REDUCTION THROUGH ROOFTOP SOLAR" at Hotel Ramada by Wyndham on 30th Nov 2022. The seminar was well attended by more than 120 delegates from industrial clusters of Jalandhar, Chandigarh and nearby areas. Mr. Dinesh Gupta, Honorary Secretary, Institute of Indian Foundrymen, Mr. Saurabh Gupta, Chairman IIF-NR, Mr. Balram Kapoor, Chairman, IIF-Chandigarh Chapter, graced the event with their august presence.

Mr. Inder Pal Singh, Deputy Chief Engineer, PSPCL Jalandhar was the chief guest.

Welcoming all the delegates, Chairman, Chandigah Chapter, Mr. Balram Kapur said that electricity cost is a challenge before the industries today. Due to this the cost of production also increases considerably and in this era of competition it has become very difficult for the industry to compete.

He said that in many countries of Europe, sunlight is available only for 4 to 6 hours, yet the use of solar energy is very high there.

In this matter, he cited a big company of Indore and said that after installing the solar panels, electricity bill got reduced and the cost of the plant was also completed in four years.

Mr. Sanjeev Juneja Secretary of IIF-Chandigarh Chapter said that India has tremendous scope of generating solar energy. The geographical location of the country stands to its benefit for generating solar energy. The reason being India is a tropical country and it receives solar radiation almost throughout the year, which amounts to 3,000 hours of sunshine. This is equal to more than 5,000 trillion kWh. Almost all parts of India receive 4-7 kWh of solar radiation per sq meters. This is equivalent to 2,300–3,200 sunshine hours per year.

During the seminar, Mr. Vinay Luthra, Past Chairman, IIF-Northern Region, shared the information about the activities of Chandigarh chapter.

Thereafter Mr. Saurabh Gupta, Chairman, IIF-Northern Region, shared detailed information about the projects and initiative taken up by the Northern region of the interest of its chapters.

Mr. Dinesh Gupta, Honorary Secretary, Institute of Indian Foundrymen, shared information about the various initiatives being taken by IIF for the benefit of its members. The net cost to end customer is Rs. 35000 to Rs 50000 per kilowatt depending on the capacity installed. He informed that as per Punjab Govt. Regulations maximum capacity of Rooftop Solar system to be installed at consumer's premises shall not exceed 70% of the sanctioned load or contract demand of the consumer whichever is lower. He also informed the members that 40% depreciation is given on rooftop solar system. He also presented success story of many industries that installed rooftop solar. He also talked about

- Savings and Payback on Solar
- Understanding ROI
- Safety and quality aspects of Solar

During the seminar, Mr. Amit Kumar, SIDBI Branch Manger shared detailed information about solar roof top and its loan schemes as well.

Chief guest Mr. Inderpal Singh appreciated the efforts of the organization and said that the industry must adopt solar system. He also added that industry should move towards rooftop solar as govt. is very supportive and proactive on clean and green energy.

Mr. Pradeep Mittal in his concluding remarks expressed the interest to have stronger ties with Namibia and the region to promote and accelerate market research and business expansion. He invited Namibia to partner and participate in the 71st IFC/ IFEX 2023 and also, advised and requested H.E for an interaction with other IIF members going forward.
